



Enamel and enamelled or vitrified products

Free movement of goods is ensured by the harmonisation of technical regulations at European level and, where the legislation is not harmonised, by the principle of “mutual recognition”. Below is information relating to enamel and enamelled or vitrified products.

Scope

“**Enamel**” or “**enamels**” exclusively mean vitrifiable products resulting from the fusion, vitrification or sintering of a substance made of mineral materials.

These designations also apply to the substance during the various stages preceding its final state.

These products are used to form one or more layers of a vitrified coating, melted at a temperature of at least 500°C.

Regulations

Regulation is not harmonised at European level

French regulation
